



iPhonebook™ Version 3.0 User Manual

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1. iPhonebook Overview

iPhonebook is a mobile phone data service that wirelessly connects you to your address book. The application enables you to search for contact information, select a phone number and connect the call. Additionally, you can choose a subset of your iPhonebook contacts to download directly to the phone's native address book.

When you register for iPhonebook service, an online address book is created (your **Web Account**). You will populate the online address book by synchronizing your existing PIM contacts (typically Microsoft Outlook®, Outlook Express®, Lotus Notes® or Palm™) with the Web Account. Alternatively, you may choose to manually enter contact data through the Web Account or import your contacts.

If you have not already registered for iPhonebook, please do so at www.iphonebook.net. By registering you receive the free synchronization software that enables you to synchronize your existing contacts and access them from your phone and from your Web Account.

2. Getting Started

There are three easy steps to get started with the iPhonebook service:

1. Purchase iPhonebook using your mobile phone
2. Register to create your **Web Account**
3. Synchronize your **PC desktop PIM** contacts with your new **Web Account**

NOTE: Steps 2 and 3 require access to your PC and an Internet connection.

Step 1 – Purchase iPhonebook using your mobile phone

Using your mobile phone, navigate to the application download area. Then select the shopping cart icon and locate the iPhonebook application (if you can't find iPhonebook, check www.iphonebook.net for availability on your phone model). Selecting iPhonebook will download the application to your phone over-the-air; the iPhonebook icon will appear in your BREW application area (Figure 1).



When you launch iPhonebook a screen appears with instructions to register and create your **Web Account**.

Step 2 – Go to www.iphonebook.net and Register to create your Web Account (do this from your PC)

During the registration process, you will:

- Input your mobile phone number and create a PIN for mobile phone access. **IMPORTANT: you must input your mobile phone number accurately during account registration; otherwise you will not be able to access your contacts from your phone!**
- Input your email address and create a password for access to your **Web Account** (where you can manage your account and select phone numbers to download to your phone)
- Download and install the **Synchronization software** on your PC

Note: It is strongly recommended that you use the PC Synchronization software to synchronize your existing PC contacts to your iPhonebook Web Account. However, iPhonebook does provide

three other options to get your contacts into iPhonebook: Import, Upload from Phone and Manual Entry (described later).

3. Using iPhonebook to Access Your Contacts from Your Phone

When iPhonebook is launched for the first time on your phone, you will see information screens on getting started, then the **iPhonebook Start Screen** is displayed (see Figure 2).

The Introduction link reviews the steps needed to take to get started. If you have already followed the Getting Started instructions in the previous section, go directly to **Login (next section)**. If not, go back to the Getting Started section.

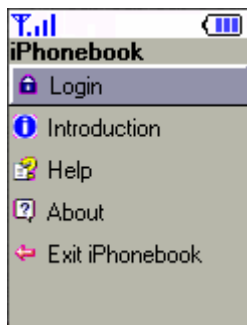

3.1. Login

- Highlight and select **Login** from the iPhonebook Menu.
- Enter your Mobile Access PIN chosen during registration. **Select** to continue. See Figure 3.

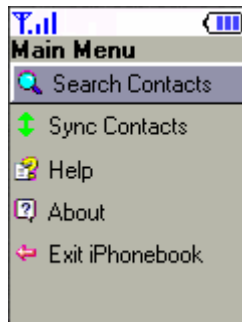


Figure 4. Main Menu

- Upon successful login, the display will show the Main Menu. See Figure 4.

Note: You'll only have to enter your PIN the first time you log in, after that you'll go directly to the Main Menu.

3.2. Search Contacts

iPhonebook allows you to do an online search of all the contacts in your **Web Account**. Use this feature for accessing infrequently used contacts, or for accessing data other than phone numbers and email addresses, such as addresses or notes.

- From the iPhonebook Main Menu, highlight and select **Search Contacts**. The *Search Contacts* display is shown. See Figure 5.
- A search can be done by Last Name, First Name, and/or Company. Only one of these fields needs to be populated to receive search results. The more fields used however, the more narrow and precise the search results.

Searching Contacts

- The **Search Contact** display shows three available fields. To search for a contact, enter at least one character (alpha/numeric) in any of the three fields (Last Name, First Name, Company). The first field highlighted is Last Name.
- Use the up/down button to move from field to field. Highlight and select **Go!** at any time when you wish to start the search. **Go!** is automatically highlighted after a character is entered in any of the fields.
- Once a field is selected and search criteria entered, press **Select** to submit the information. The **Search Contact** display is returned where you can either select another field to narrow the search, or select **Go!** to start the search.

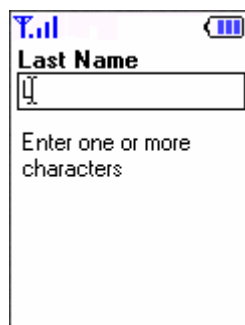


Figure 6. Entering a search based on Last Name starting with an "L"

- Using the example above, Last Name was highlighted and selected. "L" was entered as the criteria for Last Name. No other fields were entered. See Figure 6.

- Upon selecting **Go!**, the Search Results screen appears after a few moments. Using our example, the first ten contacts that meet the search criteria for Last Name "L" are displayed in alphabetical (Last Name, First Name, Company) order. See Figure 7. If the desired contact is not in the ten listed, the search needs to be narrowed by entering more specific search criteria.
- If only one contact is found, the phone numbers for the contact are immediately displayed. If no contacts are found, a message is displayed: "Search Results are empty; try again." Press **Select** to return to Search Contacts screen.

3.3. Select / Browse a Contact

From the **Search Results** display, highlight and select the desired contact. The display will show the contact's name and all the available phone numbers for the contact. Only the fields that have content will be displayed. See Figure 8. You can highlight and select any number to automatically dial that number. Continue to page 6.

The possible phone numbers for a contact are (in order of display):

- (M)** Mobile phone number
- (B)** Business number
- (H)** Home number
- (F)** Fax number

Details... Menu Item

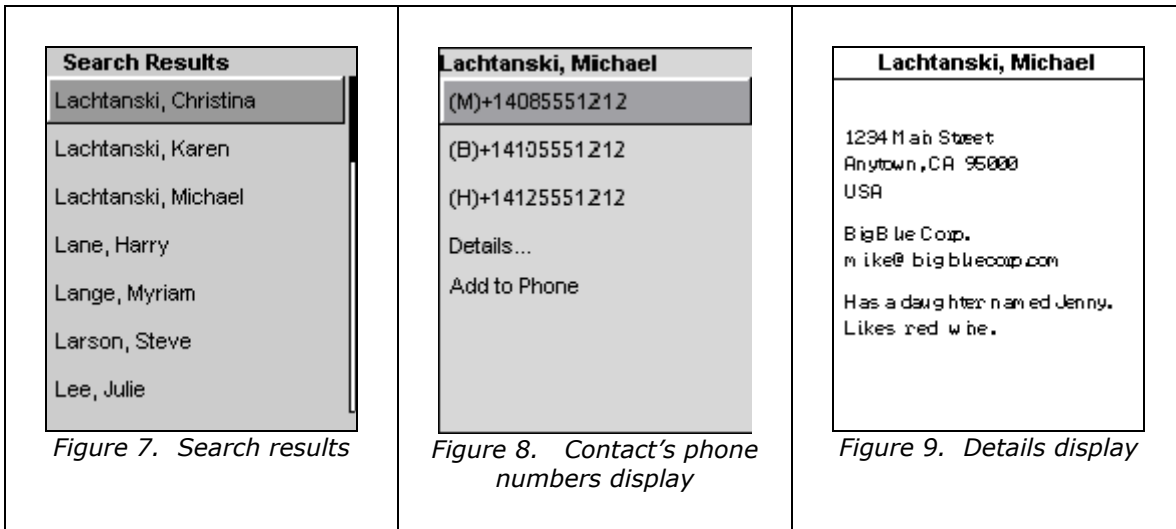
You may highlight and select **Details...** to browse through other contact information about this particular contact. The following fields will be displayed if content is available: See Figure 9.

- Address** (street address, city, state, country, zip code)
- Company Name**
- Email Address**
- Notes Field** (the first 99 characters of the Notes field)

Pressing **Select** or **Clear** will return you to the phone numbers screen.

Add to Phone Menu Item

If you want to add the contact to your phone's native address book, press **Add to Phone**. The contact's phone numbers and Email address (if present) will be saved on the phone for quick access.



3.4. Placing a Call

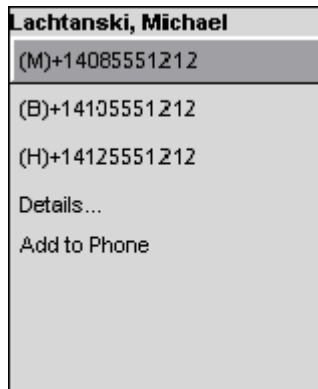


Figure 10. Selecting a number

- Once a contact's phone numbers are displayed, **Select** the desired phone number (mobile, business, home, or fax). See Figure 10. You may also use the Green Call button instead of the Select function.
- Depending on the phone model, a privacy alert may be displayed prompting you to confirm call completion: "Allow this application to place a phone call?" See Figure 11.
- Highlight and select **YES** to initiate the call.
- Highlight and select **NO** to go to the previous display.

3.5. Syncing Contacts with Phone's Native Address Book

The **Sync Contacts** menu item is used to synchronize contacts on your phone with contacts in your PC PIM (e.g., Outlook). **Sync Contacts** downloads selected contacts from your Web Account to your phone's native address book, and uploads any new or edited contacts from your phone to your iPhonebook Web Account (which are then synchronized to your PC PIM using the PC Sync software).

You can add, edit and delete the contacts stored on your phone by using the Desktop PIM or your iPhonebook Web Account to make your changes, synchronizing and using the **Sync Contacts** menu item.

Before you can use the **Sync Contacts** option to download contacts to your phone, you must first select which contacts you wish to download. See next section.

Choosing Contacts for Download

There are two different ways to choose contacts for download to your phone's native address book:

1. Use your PC PIM (Microsoft Outlook only)
2. Use your iPhonebook Web Account

Note: The space available on the phone's native address book is limited. Additionally, different handsets have different feature limitations. You should check www.xpberix.com for the number of entries allowed for your phone model and any feature limitations. Because there is no limit to the number of iPhonebook entries you may have, you may have to select a subset for the phone's native address book. You will be notified if you have selected more contacts than the native address book can accommodate.

Using your PC Desktop PIM (Microsoft Outlook only) to Select Contacts

Select and deselect contacts by adding them to the "Download to Phone" category within Outlook (older versions of the synchronization software call this category "iPhonebook"). The next sync operation will make them available for a sync to your phone's native address book.

When you installed the synchronization software for use with Microsoft Outlook, a "Download to Phone" (or iPhonebook) category was added to Outlook's list of categories. Within Outlook, select one or more contacts, right click with your mouse and choose **Categories...** A list of available categories is displayed. Select the Download to Phone (iPhonebook) category and place a check next to it. Use this method to select and deselect contacts. Consult Outlook's Help to learn how to view contacts by category to view your Download to Phone (iPhonebook) category and selected contacts.

After selecting contacts and synchronizing, use the **Sync Contacts** menu on your mobile phone to save them into your phone's native address book. See Figure 12.

If the contact's information in your PC Desktop PIM has changed, the next time you sync from your PC and perform the **Sync Contacts** function on your phone, those changes will be made to your phone's native address book.

Using your iPhonebook Web Account to Select Contacts

Log into your iPhonebook Web Account. Place a check mark in the box next to each contact you wish to have synced to your mobile phone. Then click on the "Download to Phone" link. A Download to Phone icon will appear next to each contact that has been selected.

After selecting contacts and synchronizing, use the **Sync Contacts** menu on your mobile phone to save them into your phone's native address book. See Figure 12.

4. Synchronization Software on Your PC

When you install the PC Synchronization Software, a Sync icon is placed on your PC desktop. Double click on the icon or use the right mouse button to open the window. Each button is explained below.

Setup Wizard. The Setup Wizard configures your username, password and the PC PIM you will synchronize to your Web Account. Use the Wizard in the future to change any settings such as whether you now use a different PC PIM. *NOTE: If you change your password using the Account tab in the Web Account, you must also use the Setup Wizard to change it in the synchronization software.*

Synchronize. Starts the synchronization process with your PC PIM. Use this as often as you like to make sure the contacts in your PC PIM are the same as the contacts your mobile phone will access.

Help. Launches the Help file where you can find additional information on the Setup Wizard and the Synchronization settings.

Exit. Closes the Synchronization Software application.

If you decide to terminate your iPhonebook account, you should uninstall the Synchronization Software from your PC. You can do this by using your PC's uninstall procedure or by choosing File/Uninstall iPhonebook from the Synchronization Software main menu.

Important Warning: In some cases, the synchronization process will truncate data. This occurs only if the data in your PC desktop PIM fields is longer than the allowable fields in iPhonebook. iPhonebook typically allows the same field lengths as most popular PC PIMs; however, in some cases, iPhonebook's fields may be shorter. If this occurs, an alert will be displayed. As a result, the truncated data will not be available through the Web Account, or through iPhonebook's mobile phone application. Additionally, if you make changes on the affected record in the Web Account and then use the synchronization feature, any truncated fields will be synchronized back to your PC PIM.

5. Additional Support

On the Mobile Phone

On screen, context sensitive help is available at any time by pressing the asterisk "*" key.

On your iPhonebook Web Account

Log in to your iPhonebook Web Account for details on using the PIM functionality. A Help link is available in the upper right corner of every web page. Full details about your iPhonebook Web Account are available by page context or by overall functions and features.
